One Outcome per year will be considered on a rotating basis. For Outcomes 2-4 the Committee will review a sample of the materials (20% of the submissions) based on a rubric (in development). Language proficiency (Outcome 1) data will be considered for 100% of our majors based on the successful completion of the highest level language required for a major.
